The Course

Designed during America's golden age of golf course design, Westchester is one of the oldest courses on the PGA Tour. John Bowman's plan for his Westchester Biltmore Hotel was for Travis to design thirty-six holes over the sprawling 500-acres on a hilltop in Rye, New York. The plot was also to include a 400-room hotel, tennis courts, and polo fields. Travis managed to fit in two-eighteens and a nine-hole par-three course. The West course, on which the pros play, winds up and down rugged, rocky hills. It is not long, but demands accuracy off the tees.

For the tournament, the nines are reversed. Play begins on a par three and the back starts with a "easy four" of only 320 yards. Following that, the course has the two most difficult holes, numbers eleven and twelve. Eleven plays downhill to a creek that comes into play and twelve, another par four, is usually a par-five for members. The approach is played to an elevated green. An enormous oak guards the corner at number fifteen. The final hole invites birdies, though the bunkers short of the green collect more shots than most would think.

The first Westchester Classic was held in 1967 and won by Jack Nicklaus. In the middle of the 18th fairway is a plaque that commemorates the shot played by Bob Gilder in the third round of the 1982 event. Leading at the time, Gilder hit a three-wood second shot 251 yards into the hole for a double eagle and went on to win the tournament.

Architect's Notes

This was one more of a challenge than the recent courses I've done, because of the lack of information I started with. I used the first and third editions of "Golf Courses of the PGA Tour" (as usual) and purchased a shot book from the 2005 Buick Classic. Those coupled along with photos of the back nine from the Internet helped with the "visuals". I started with aerials from "Google Earth" and a topo map for all the general elevations. I think it's pretty close, but I'll be watching the next Classic to see where I missed .
